

Boswell Regional Center is proud to provide an array of services to individuals with developmental disabilities which include: home and community supports, supervised living, crisis support, employment opportunities, behavioral services, and day services.

As of April 1, 2014, Boswell Regional Center added a new service to that list, Community Crisis Transition Homes. The Transitions Homes opened on April 1, 2014, with the first person being admitted on April 2nd. The program has grown and is currently at full capacity with 6 individuals being served. The transition homes serve persons 18 years and older who have limited service options available to them. They may not qualify for the ICF/MR programs and may not be eligible or enrolled in waiver services. Therefore, they may literally have no where to go.

"The ultimate goal is to transition everyone into the community." This is done through providing 24-hour-a -day staff who assists with skill enhancement and services such as cooking, cleaning, day habilitation, travel to and from medical appointments, and employment opportunities.

Although this program is currently located on Boswell's main campus, there are exciting plans to move into the community in the future. Currently all individuals already attend programs such as work and day services in the community. The ultimate goal is to provide each person with options such as supported living or assisted living, or other options depending on the level of support needed, and community employment that will allow them to reach his/her dream to live a fulfilling community life.
