Two of our programs on campus had the opportunity to do so on May 21, 2013, at Hillcrest Nursing Center in Magee, Mississippi. Denise Brown, Teacher/Supervisor of Prime Timers and Maplewood Activity Programs, Kay Adcox, LSW, Social Worker for Pine Lake Geriatric Services along with F. Mason of the Sparkling Gems Club participated in visiting with one our Veterans, Mr. Grady L. Purvis. Mr. Purvis is a resident of Hillcrest Nursing Center. It was a pleasure to present Mr. Purvis with a gift basket filled with coasters, crosses, picture albums, and mini flower pots decorated by individuals and staff of Pine Lake Geriatric Services. The gift basket was made for the Veterans and Residents of Hillcrest Nursing Center.

Hillcrest Nursing Center Administrator, Mark Martinolich, gave the following history on Mr. Grady L. Purvis: Mr. Purvis is 90 years old and a veteran of World War II. As a member of the 17th Airborne Division he participated in one of the largest successful airborne operations of World War II, Operation Varsity, in March of 1945. As he tells it - "I was just a young boy off the farm. I didn't know anything and could have been killed, but I didn't think about that. I was ready to go." Mr. Purvis often wears a cap with a flag design and is still a patriot to this day. He took two flags from the gift basket and put them in his pocket, smiling as he did so.
